
October 24-26 – CERT Basic Training

Disaster Communications

When All Else Fails Communications

A neighborhood radio network is a great way to support each other when the phones stop working. And if that neighborhood has access to a licensed and trained amateur radio operator, they may be able to communicate information to a regional Emergency Operation Center (EOC). Information such as damage assessments can help to ensure that their neighborhood receives appropriate attention during the response. Communities might also receive information back about what is going on in the area and possibly be able to transmit status reports to friends and family. The Stanwood Camano Amateur Radio Club has partnered with the CPG to provide Amateur Radio Operators for just this purpose. Contact the CPG if your neighborhood is interested!

Weather

Camano's greatest risk for a disaster is severe weather. Understanding weather can help you become better prepared.

Information for this portion of our newsletter comes from NW Meteorologist Ted Buehner; from NOAA; from the National Weather Service; from Island County Department of Emergency Management; and from the Climate Prediction Center.

Here we are, back in the fall/winter storm season and already experiencing winds and rain. NOAA has upgraded their fall/winter predictions to a 71% chance of a weak La Niña. The impact of this weather pattern will be greatest during the winter months. This could mean more precipitation than normal for October through December. Predictions of below normal temperatures have also come from NOAA. Be prepared!

Planning Ahead for November

For those who are new to this newsletter, this segment allows for an ongoing look at spreading the cost of preparedness supplies over a year rather than trying to acquire everything all at once. Also included are measures you can take to prepare for any emergency/disaster.
